- 70 maintained and independent schools currently engaged in the CAMHS School Link pilot and further training is ongoing. Of these 19 are Jewish maintained and independent schools.
- Schools receive training and support to enable direct referrals to CAMHS
- Advice and guidance on individual cases from the link worker

- **Schools Counselling Small Grants**
- Population Health funding received to fund schools on a matching funding basis to deliver targeted counselling provision in school for vulnerable pupils during 2018- 20 which supported 18 schools to commission new/additional counselling support for vulnerable pupils. The project has been evaluated and will inform a whole-system review of counselling for children and young people in 2020.

Healthy Schools Grants

Healthy Schools Fund 19/20 – up to £5000 to deliver activities to improve health and wider wellbeing or mental and emotional well-being of children in primary school – 16 projects currently funded to the value of £74,353 new grant programme will open later in the year

Community Partnership Challenge Fund 19/20 – up to £15,000 to partnerships between schools and VCSE organizations to engage families and communities in the life of the school and to develop community assets to improve health and well-being of children and young people – 8 projects currently funded to the value of £105,000, new grant programme will open later in the year
